## Juvenile Justice 2001 -2011 Criminal and Welfare Concerns

To mark the 10 year anniversary of the Children's Act 2001, the Association for Criminal Justice Research and Development and Barnardos held a joint seminar on Tuesday 8th November which examined the legislative developments since 2001 which have impacted on children and young people involved with the criminal justice and State welfare system.

Minister for Children and Youth Affairs Frances Fitzgerald opened the event and reaffirmed the Government's commitment to hold a referendum on children's rights next year. She suggested the proposed constitutional amendment as potentially "a watershed moment."

Among the highlights of this bulletin are two Court of Criminal Appeal cases involving sentencing of Section 15A drug possession offences – *Wall* and *Ormonde*; a new Scottish case *Docherty et al* on stopping-out; a potentially significant US Supreme Court decision on mandatory strip searching - even for people detained for minor offences and fine default - in *Florence v Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Burlington & Others*; and a large number of ECtHR decisions.
