ACJRD is pleased to announce that **Tim Chapman** will deliver this year's Martin Tansey Memorial Lecture.

Tim Chapman is the current Chair of the Board of the European Forum for Restorative Justice (EFRJ) and a leading international expert on restorative justice issues. He is a visiting lecturer at the University of Ulster in Northern Ireland teaching on the Masters programme in Restorative Practices. He has contributed to the development of restorative conferencing in both the voluntary and statutory sectors in Northern Ireland. He spent over 25 years working in the Probation Board for Northern Ireland (PBNI), playing an active part in developing "evidence-based practice" both with adults and young people. He has published widely on restorative justice and effective practice and has conducted significant research into restorative justice in Northern Ireland.

Call for Submissions: Addressing the Over-Representation of Children in Care in the Criminal Justice System

The <u>Irish Penal Reform Trust</u> has commissioned research on the over-representation of children in care or with care experience in the criminal justice system. The research will be carried out by Dr. Nicola Carr (University of Nottingham) and Dr. Paula Mayock (Trinity College Dublin). To date there has been no specific published research focusing on the links between care and criminalisation in Ireland. This project has two main aims:

- To examine the extent of, and the reasons for the over-representation of children in care or with care experience in the criminal justice system in Ireland and;
- To identify the best ways to address and reduce the criminalisation of these young people.

International research on this topic points to individual and systemic factors that may lead careexperienced young people to come into contact with the criminal justice system at a higher rate than their non-care peers.

Horse Care Prison Rehabilitation Project

A new horse-care prisoner rehabilitation unit, planned for Castlerea Prison in Co Roscommon in 2018, will be the first project of its kind in Europe.

The prisoner rehabilitation concept revolves around the natural bond between the horse and the human, not only at the emotional level but also in terms of practical skills.

There will be designated courses planned for potential blacksmiths, saddlers, an ability to ride and, most importantly, the care for the well-being of the horse.

This unit hopes to emulate the success of similar units internationally in terms of ultimately reducing prisoner re-offending levels through increased well-being and sense of responsibility and respect via equine skills development and better job prospects.
